This website is partially compliant with the <u>Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.1</u> AA standard, due to the non-compliances and exemptions'] listed below.

#### Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations: Some images do not have a text alternative, so people using a screen reader cannot access the information. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). We plan to add text alternatives for all exiting images as soon as possible. When we publish any new content we'll make sure our use of images meets accessibility standards.

#### **Navigation and accessing information**

There's no way to skip the repeated content in the page header (for example, a 'skip to main content' option). It's not always possible to change the device orientation from horizontal to vertical without making it more difficult to view the content. It may not possible for users to change text size without some of the content overlapping.

### Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

PDFs and other documents - The accessibility regulations <u>do not require us to fix PDFs or other</u> <u>documents published before 23 September 2018</u> if they're not essential to providing our services. Any new PDFs or Word documents we publish will meet accessibility standards.
